# STEPS FOR ENROLLMENT

#### 1. ADMISSIONS

- Admission can be completed in person in room 1104-B1 or on-line by going to http://seattlecentral.org/admissions/.
- Acceptance to Seattle Central College does *not* guarantee entrance into AD&D. To ensure
  the application process to AD&D is complete, you must follow each of the four steps to be
  on the approved list.

### 2. ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Students must show that they are ready to take College Composition (English 101) and Algebra (MAT 087) by either taking the EDSP and MDSP placement tests for Admissions, or providing transcripts from any previously attended accredited institution(s). Information on admissions testing is on the Seattle Central College website

- Math Direct Self Placement

- Computer Competency Students are expected to have sufficient skills in file management, Microsoft Excel, and Word programs. See 'Computer Requirements' handout for more details.
- **Transcripts:** Obtain a copy of any previous college transcripts and continue to the next step. (Math scores are only good for 3 years. After that, you will need to take the math placement test.)

#### 3. ADVISING

- Once you have been admitted to Seattle Central and have taken the English and Math placement tests or collected transcripts, EMAIL your Workforce Education Counselor: Advising - room BE1102D

- What to send:
  - ✓ Student ID/ CTC Link number
  - ✓ Send a copy of your transcript or let them know your DSP testing outcomes.
  - Ask to be put on the admissions list for AD&D. This saves your place in line for enrollment and should be your first step!

#### 4. REQUIRED SEWING SKILLS

- Students wishing to enter this AD&D must also demonstrate *intermediate sewing skills*.
- Intermediate sewing skills can be demonstrated by completing APPRL 096, 098, and 100.
  Those wishing to go directly into APPRL 100 must have previous experience with industrial equipment and construction techniques. The test out can be arranged by contacting Rebecca Johnston by email to schedule a test date. A minimum of 1 year of experience is recommended to attempt the test out option.
- <u>Testing out will require an email screening with photo examples of your previous work</u> before being considered for testing out options.

## 5. APPROVAL FOR FULL-TIME PROGRAM

- Once all the enrollment steps are completed, you will be placed on the **APPROVED LIST.**
- Position on the approved list is determined by the date in which you were put on the admissions list with advising and have informed the office that you completed all the enrollment requirements.

- **Enrollment is once a year in the Fall.** Once you have completed all of the Steps above you will be sent enrollment information and registration forms over e-mail. So please keep your e-mail current and let the AHSS office know of any steps completed ASAP.
- A required orientation will be held a week before classes start! Keep your calendars open.

#### 6. TUITION COSTS

- Tuition Costs Per Credit: These costs fluctuate quarterly, please check SCC website.
  - ✓ Resident \$123.58
  - ✓ Non-Resident \$140.92
  - ✓ International \$317.95
- AD&D Quarterly cost estimates:
  - √ 12-19 credit quarters range from \$1,482 \$2,348 (resident price)
  - ✓ Total estimated cost of tuition and supplies \$14,000
- One-time supply kit costs:
  - ✓ Skill Development course kit \$65 (APPRL 099)
  - ✓ Full Time course kits: Art supply kit \$200 Sewing kit \$400
  - ✓ Books \$100-\$300
  - ✓ Final Project Supplies (Clothing, Portfolio, & Display) \$500-\$1,000
- Always keep about \$20 cash with you for small purchases during quarter.
- We recommend working <u>no more than</u> 10 hours a week on top of the full-time program. It's
  a large time demand and we want you to be able to succeed with the rigor and deadlineoriented class load. So be prepared to open your personal schedules to accommodate.
